"Woman, why do you involve me?" Jesus replied. "My hour has not yet come." "His mother said to the servants, "Do whatever He tells you."
Prayer is not so much asking God to do what you want. It is more asking God to do what is right. It's mostly, "God whatever You want-that's what I want."
Vs.6-10 "Nearby stood six stone water jars, the kind used by the Jews for ceremonial washing, each holding from twenty to thirty gallons. Jesus said to the servants, "Fill the jars with water"; so they filled them to the brim. Then he told them, "Now draw some out and take it to the master of the banquet. They did so and the master of the banquet tasted the water that had been turned into wine. He did not realize where it had come from, though the servants who had drawn the water knew. Then he called the bridegroom aside and said, "Everyone brings out the choice wine first and then the cheaper wine after the guests have had too much to drink; but you have saved the best till now."
When we take our problems to Jesus and ask Him to solve them, everyone is blessed. There is a cascading of blessing that comes.
Vs.11-12 "What Jesus did here in Cana of Galilee was the first of the signs through which he revealed his glory; and his disciples believed in him. After this he went down to Capernaum with his mother and brothers and his disciples. There they stayed for a few days."
Here's the question What prompted Jesus to perform this miracle?
Could it be that your simple prayer or request to God could prompt such heavenly action that it could completely change any given situation?
Regarding prayer, I do believe that there are things that we cannot change - I think God's character is immutable. Our prayers will never cause Him to be anything but Good.
